




IF YOU ARE APPROACHED BY A FEDERAL IMMIGRATION OFFICER

CALM	Remember to remain calm if the interaction causes concern. Safety is our top priority.
REPORT	<p>If the agent does not respond and proceeds assertively with their actions, or enters non-public spaces without permission, do not interfere or obstruct them.</p> <p> Contact the CSUF Police Department at 911 (call or text if on campus) or 657-278-2515.</p>
INFORM	<p>If the agent presents a warrant or subpoena, inform the agent that you are not obstructing their process and do not have the authority to respond to the request.</p> <p> Call Risk Management (HRIE) at 657-278-7475 (Anne Grogan, John Beisner, or Michael Coughlin are the only campus officials designated to review federal warrants and subpoenas).</p> <p> If the contact occurs outside of business hours, call Risk Management at 657-278-7475 or the CSUF Police Department at 657-278-2515.</p> <p>If possible, provide Risk Management or the CSUF Police Department with the agency affiliation, number of agents, and other identifying information.</p>

IF YOU SEE A FEDERAL IMMIGRATION OFFICER / VEHICLE ON CAMPUS OR READ A SOCIAL MEDIA POST NOTING FEDERAL AGENT ON CAMPUS

CALM > Remember to remain calm if what you see or read causes concern. Safety is our top priority.

REPORT > Report as soon as possible what you see or read to either:

📱 CSUF Police Department at 911 (call or text if on campus) or 657-278-2515

📱 Risk Management (HRIE) at 657-278-7475

INFORM > Provide as much information as possible when reporting. Doing so will help verification efforts.

Do not interfere or obstruct if you choose to take photographs or video.

FOLLOW PROTOCOL > If an interaction occurs, follow the protocol on the other side of this card.
